I. Library Visits

Classes within the Batavia Library District are welcome to visit the Library for a tour or short program, or to arrange for a librarian to visit them. Call the Youth Services Department at 879-1393 ext. 500 to schedule a visit.

III. Class Projects

- Visit, call the Library, or search the Library's online catalog at www.BataviaPublicLibrary.org to find out what materials are available when planning class projects.
- Notify the Library as far in advance as possible of the assignment. The Library has created a simple and brief "Assignment Alert" form that teachers are encouraged to use when an assignment calls for students to visit the public library.

 - If you need materials sent from the Public Library to your School Library, requests must be made through your School's LRC Director. See "Borrowing Materials from the Library."
- Check for availability of materials at the appropriate reading level for your students.
- Give students a choice on reading lists.
 Be willing to let them ask a librarian to help them choose a similar title if copies of the desired title are unavailable.
- Students can use our databases from inside the Library without a library card. If they do have a Batavia Public Library card, they're able to access databases from home. Homework resources and reference databases are available at: https://tinyurl.com/bplhmwk



IV. Borrowing Materials from the Library

- Teacher requests for materials <u>must</u> be made through the school's LRC director.
 The Library is happy to arrange delivery of these items via the school district van.
- Teachers are welcome to borrow items from the Library using their personal home library card.
- Library cards from neighboring public libraries are accepted at the Batavia Public Library. Students and teachers should apply for a library card from their home library.
